# PRIVACY POLICY FOR WHISTLEBLOWER ARRANGEMENT

#### **NETCOMPANY-INTRASOFT S.A.**

This Privacy Policy explains how Netcompany-Intrasoft S.A. based in Luxembourg ("Netcompany-Intrasoft", "we" or "us") processes personal information in connection with reports to Netcompany-Intrasoft's Whistleblower Arrangement.

Below is a description of the personal data processing that takes place and the rights you have if you are reported through the Whistleblower Arrangement, as well as your rights if you use the Whistleblower Arrangement to report another person.

Reference is also made to Netcompany-Intrasoft's Whistleblower Policy, containing information about who can submit reports and who can be reported.

This policy only concerns the handling and the investigation of reports submitted through the Whistleblower Arrangement. Therefore, this policy must - in relation to employees - be seen in connection with Netcompany-Intrasoft's other relevant policies and procedures.

# 2 DESCRIPTION OF THE PROCESSING

#### 2.1 Mandatory Whistleblower Arrangement pursuant to the Whistleblower Law

The following is a description of how Netcompany-Intrasoft will process information on the person who is reported about (the "**Reported Person**") as well as the person who is submitting the report (the "**Whistleblower**") in connection with reports to Netcompany-Intrasoft 's Whistleblower Arrangement established pursuant to the Law of 16 May 2023 transposing Directive (EU) 2019/1937 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2019 on the protection of persons who report breaches of Union law(the "**Luxembourg Whistleblower Law**").

- The contents of your report.

As a rule, no sensitive information about you will be processed as part of the handling of the report - unless you choose to provide such information yourself.

However, information on criminal offences or possible criminal offences may be included in the processing if there is a suspicion that the submitted report is deliberately false.

- The data subject (i.e. the Whistleblower) has given consent to the processing of his/her personal data (GDPR, Article 6.1.a).
- GDPR, Article 6.1.f: processing is necessary for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by Netcompany-Intrasoft or by a third party including Netcompany-Intrasoft risk management and establishing, exercising, or defending legal claims.
- GDPR, Article 9.2.b: Processing is necessary for reasons of carrying out the obligations and exercising specific rights of Netcompany-Intrasoft or of the data subject in the field of employment, on the basis of Articles 6 and 7 of the Whistleblower Law;
- GDPR, Article 9.2.f: processing is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims or whenever courts are acting in their judicial capacity.

- The police
- Public authorities, including the Financial Supervisory Authority, the Data Protection Authority, the Registration, Domains and VAT Administration, the Labour Inspectorate (Inspection du Travail et des Mines), the Centre for Equal Treatment, the Regulation Institute, the Direct taxation administration.
- legitimate reasons for continued retention.
- Reports falling outside the scope of the Arrangement, but not appearing to be unfounded, will be passed on to Netcompany-Intrasoft's Group Legal Counsel where they will be processed in accordance with Netcompany-Intrasoft's relevant policies and procedures.
- Reports turning out to be unfounded will be immediately closed in the Arrangement and deleted within 45 days after having been deemed to be unfounded.
- If a report is conveyed to the police or another public authority, the data will be retained for at least as long as the investigation is in progress at the police/public authority.
- Otherwise, the data will be stored in accordance with Netcompany-Intrasoft's deletion policy.

#### 3 INFORMATION TO THE WHISTLEBLOWER

If you submit a report, access to your data and any information that can lead to your identification is only available to the competent persons within Netcompany-Intrasoft's Whistleblower Arrangement. This information may be disclosed to third parties only in cases where it is required by EU or Luxembourg law, in the context of investigations by competent authorities or in the context of legal proceedings.

# 4 INFORMATION TO THE REPORTED PERSON AND RECTIFICATION

If you are subject to a report submitted through the Whistleblower Arrangement, you will be notified as soon as possible after an initial investigation has taken place and all relevant evidence is secured. In this connection, you will receive information about:

- The identity of the person(s) who is/are responsible for the investigation of the report
- A description of the contents of the report

As mentioned below in the section about your general rights, you have a right of access to the report that was submitted about you. However, your right to access to the report might be limited in accordance with the Luxembourg Whistleblower Law.

You also have the right to request rectification of the information in the report if you believe this to be false, misleading, or incomplete. If your request in this respect cannot be met, the information will be supplemented with your comments.

# 5 CONSEQUENCES OF THE PROCESSING

Reports and investigation of reports to the Whistleblower Arrangement may have significant consequences for the person who is reported, as reports concern violations or suspected violations of the law, as further outlined in the separate guidelines for the Arrangement.

Likewise, a report to the Whistleblower Arrangement may have significant consequences for the person who has submitted the report in case of a deliberately false report. Such cases may have criminal consequences.

# 6 TRANSFERS TO COUNTRIES OUTISE THE EU/EEA

Your personal data will not be transferred to countries outside the EU/EEA.

### 7 YOUR GENERAL RIGHTS

You have the following rights:

- You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time, without affecting the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.
- You have the right to request access to and rectification or deletion of your personal data.
- You also have the right to object to the processing of your personal data and have the processing of your personal data restricted.
- You have the right to receive the personal information provided by yourself in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format (data portability).
- You may always lodge a complaint with a data protection supervisory authority, e.g. The Luxembourg Data Protection Authority (Commission Nationale pour la Protection des Données) at the following address: 15, Boulevard du Jazz, L-4370 Belvaux, Grand Duchy of Luxembourg.

You are furthermore entitled to dispute our processing of your personal data in the following events:

• If our processing of your personal data is based on the GDPR, Article 6.1 (f) (balancing of interests), see above under legal basis for the processing, you are, at any time, entitled to object on grounds relating to your particular situation at any time to the processing of your personal data.

There may be conditions or limitations on these rights as foreseen by the GDPR, e.g., you may not be entitled to deletion of your personal data in a specific case – this depends on the specific circumstances of the processing activities.
